PROFESSIONS ON FAST TRACK FOR GROWTH

Speech-language pathology and audiology will be among the hottest professions in the country in the next decade according to recent employment and growth projects in the U.S. Bureau of Labor and Statistics' 2002-03 *Occupational Outlook Handbook*.

The professions ranked among the top 30-out of 700 fastest growing occupations over the next decade, with the number of audiology positions expected to climb 45% and the number of speech-language pathology positions to grow by 39% from 2000-2010.

In Ohio, 270 positions annually are anticipated across all settings through the year 2008 according to the U.S. Dept. of Labor and Statistics.
